UNPACKING

After unpacking unit, inspect carefully for any damage that may have occurred during transit. Check for loose, missing, or damaged parts. If any damage is observed, a shipping damage claim must be filed with carrier. DO NOT use the OEMTOOLS® 24855TWO 1,500 Lb. Hydraulic Vehicle Positioning Jack (2 Pack) if broken, bent, cracked or damaged parts (including labels) are noted. Any Positioning Jack that appears damaged in any way, operates abnormally, or is missing parts should be removed from service immediately. If you suspect that the Positioning Jack was subjected to shock load (a load that was dropped suddenly, unexpectedly, etc.), immediately discontinue use until it has been checked by a factory authorized service center.

The 1,500 Lb. Hydraulic Vehicle Positioning Jack (2 Pack) is designed for use on tires to allow vehicle to be maneuvered in any direction. Easy foot pedal lifting smoothly raises vehicle. Hydraulic lift mechanism with locking pin lifts tires between (2) Rollers. Use on vehicles weighing up to 6,000 pounds (requires 4 jacks).

SPECIFIC SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS AND WARNINGS

- 1. Verify that the product and application are compatible, if in doubt call OEMTOOLS® at 1-866-458-2472.
- 2. Before using this product, read the operator's manual completely and familiarize yourself thoroughly with the product, its components and recognize the hazards associated with its use.
- 3. Wear appropriate safety gear, including heavy-duty work gloves and ANSI-approved safety goggles during use.
- 4. Do not exceed the weight capacity of the Vehicle Positioning Jack. Exceeding the maximum capacity for this product is dangerous and can lead to serious injury or property damage.
- 5. Always evaluate your task before using this Vehicle Positioning Jack. Use as intended only.
- 6. Use as intended only. Do not use for lifting human weight. Keep clear of raised load.
- Use only on a hard, level and flat surface capable of bearing the combined weight of the Vehicle Positioning Jack, load being lifted, the operator and any tools being used.
- 8. If you are working and the load becomes off-balance and/or the jack begins to tip over, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CATCH OR LIFT THE LOAD WHEN FALLING. SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY CAN RESULT! In this event, clear the area as quickly and safely as possible in order to avoid injury from the falling load, including getting hit with flying fragments.
- 9. Before each use, inspect the general condition of the Vehicle Positioning Jack. If a problem occurs, have the problem corrected before further use.

AWARNING: - TO PREVENT SERIOUS INJURY: DO NOT USE A DAMAGED OR MALFUNCTIONING VEHICLE POSITIONING JACK

- 10. If in doubt about the safety of your project, we advise you to have the work done by a professional familiar with applicable safety practices.
- 11. This is a lifting device only. Immediately after lifting, support the vehicle with appropriate means.
- 12. The use of jack stands is considered the only safe way to work under or around a vehicle. Only one end or side of the car should be supported at a time. The wheels not supported need to be choked.

AWARNING: Use the jack on a smooth level surface. DO NOT operate the jack on inclines.

AWARNING: DO NOT use the jack with tires that are wider than 10.6 inches.

AWARNING: DO NOT start the vehicle's engine or drive the vehicle with the jack in use. The jack is designed only for manual maneuvering of a vehicle.

AWARNING: The higher a vehicle is lifted the more unstable it becomes; therefore, use the lowest possible lock pin position.

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OPERATION

A. RAISING AND LOWERING VEHICLE

- 1. Hold the foot pedal, and carefully remove the foot pedal hook. (The foot pedal is spring loaded and will fly up when the hook is released.)
- 2. Remove the lock pin from the frame.
- 3. Open the release valve by turning the release knob counterclockwise.
- 4. Expand the jack by pulling the rollers apart. The jack should be wide enough to easily straddle the tire.
- 5. Position the jack so both rollers contact the tire treads. Verify there is at least 3/4" clearance between the tire and the axle of the jack; so the tire will put pressure on the rollers not the jack frame when raised. Close the release valve by turning the release knob clockwise to a snug-tight position.
- 6. Operate the foot pedal to lift the tire.
- 7. When the lift is complete place the lock pin in the hole nearest the extension rod.
- 8. To lower the jack, remove the lock pin and SLOWLY open the release valve counterclockwise.

B. BLEEDING INSTRUCTIONS

For the first use or if the Jack has not been used for a while, it may be necessary to bleed the air from the system.

- 1. Turn the Release Valve 1-1/2 turns counterclockwise.
- 2. Press the Foot Pedal at least 10 times quickly to force the air out of the system.
- 3. Top off with a clean, quality Hydraulic Jack Fluid if necessary.
- 4. Close the Release Valve.

MAINTENANCE

NOTES: Dirt is the greatest cause of failure in hydraulic units. Keep the jack clean and well lubricated to prevent foreign matter from entering the system. If the jack has been exposed to rain, snow, sand, or grit, it must be cleaned immediately to prevent rust and corrosion.

- 1. A periodic coating of light lubricating oil to pivot points, adjusting points, etc. will help to prevent rust and assure that all components move freely.
- 2. Store the jack in a well-protected area where it will not be exposed to corrosive vapors, abrasive dust, or any other harmful elements.
- 3. Replace the oil in the reservoir at least once per year. To check the oil, place the jack on level ground and expand the jack by pulling the rollers apart. Remove the oil plug. The oil level should be at the bottom of the filler plug hole. Add approved anti-wear hydraulic jack oil and install the oil plug again.

AWARNING: The use of alcohol, hydraulic brake fluid, detergent motor oil, or transmission oil could damage the seals and result in jack failure.


STORAGE
